



Reliving The Dream

Commemorating the personal journey of the great founding visionary of the Zionist Movement, Theodor Herzl, and your loved ones at the Herzl Museum

In the heart of Mount Herzl in Jerusalem, alongside the graves of the nation's founding fathers and our heroes who sacrificed their lives for the State of Israel and the Jewish people, lies the Herzl Museum. The museum was founded by the World Zionist Organization a century after the birth of Theodor Herzl, in order to impart his legacy, personal story, great vision, and worldviews to future generations.

Museumgoers embark on an hour-long audiovisual journey into Herzl's doubts, obstacles, successes, and the ideas at the base of his vision. The tour is offered in a range of languages, including Hebrew, English, Russian, French, Spanish, German, and Amharic, and offers a unique lens through which the audience can understand Herzl's disappointments and dreams. Every visitor will leave the museum with greater insight into the legacy that this significant

Jewish leader left behind, and the challenges of Zionism in Israel during the 21st century.

Additionally, in 2018, the World Zionist Organization inaugurated a personal Memorial Board next to the Herzl Museum, which provides an opportunity for people to commemorate their heroes: those who are nearest and dearest to their hearts.

Due to the museum's success, its educational team has expanded its activities to include unique, innovative tours of Mount Herzl, which expose its hidden stories and heritage, as well as workshops, courses, training programs, and a variety of educational tools to pass on Herzl's legacy and the Zionist idea to all parts of Israeli society. As a part of this expansion, a Board of Governors for the Museum was recently founded under the leadership of Dr. Nissim Levy. ➔
